STAGE 1: APPLICATION

The following students are eligible to apply:

- Students of African descent, graduating in June 2018 from a high school in an Essex County community, including but not limited to Montclair and the Oranges.
- A minimum grade point average of 2.7 (on a 4.0 scale).
- Demonstrated financial need.

Completed "Verification of Academic Performance" page – signed by guidance counselor
Official school transcript
SAT scores
Two references: one school reference and one personal reference from an adult who is not/ a relative. (Ex. church minister, employer, family friend)
Proof of family income:2016 or 2017 income tax return whichever is the most recent at the time of you submit your application, (page 1 only), social security benefits, or other proof.

STAGE 2: INTERVIEW

Applicants who meet the criteria and submit complete applications may be granted an interview. Interviews will occur in April/May 2018. Students should

- A. bring an <u>updated</u> transcript reflecting grades through the second quarter/marking period.
- B. be prepared to talk about:
 - 1. Community Involvement (i.e. volunteerism through church, school, or community outreach programs).
 - 2. Academic activities, extracurricular activities, special interests and work.
 - 3. Leadership Skills/Initiative (i.e. offices held in organizations)
 - 4. Financial Need
 - 5. Clarity of Career Goals

Acceptance to an accredited four-year school of higher education will be required to receive the scholarship. **** If you have not been accepted at the time the application is due, you may still apply pending your acceptance. ****
